The following tools will <u>not be used</u> on your pets while in the care of PetSteps Dog Training: Pinch Collars, Choke Chains, Shock Collars, Citronella or any other type of spray/correction collar, or flexi-leashes. Any other make-shift or improvised restraint system such as the figure 8 around the muzzle with a slip lead or a simple slip lead may be used in emergencies only.

The <u>recommended</u> restraints are properly fitted and secure Martingale Collars, Flat Buckle Collars, Harnesses, including No-Pull Harnesses, or properly fitted head halters. Collars will be left on the dog during their stay unless they are deemed a hazard during play sessions.

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PET DICTIONARY What commands do you use at home?

Action or Signal	Description	The word(s) your family uses
Correct	Indicates a correct action. It is meant to be a verbal "clicker" or a	
	verbal treat or reward for the dog.	
Wrong	Indicates an incorrect action has been provided by the dog.	
Sit	Dog's bum is firmly on the ground, front legs are straight, dog is	
	looking at you.	
Down	Dog's belly in firmly on the ground, front paws are out in front of	
	the dog, the dog is looking at you.	
Watch	Dog stops whatever they are doing and looks up at you directly	
	into your eyes. Position of dog does not matter.	
Wait	Dog stops moving in whatever position they are in and waits for	
	the next command. Commonly used before walking through	
	doors to prevent bolting.	
Let's Go	Indicates to the dog that is OK for them to follow you as in going	
	for a walk.	
Off	Get off of something or someone and put all four paws on the	
	floor.	
Sit-Stay	Dog is to be in the sitting position and is to remain there while	
	you leave and then come back. Sit-stay is different from wait,	
	since you do not leave the dog when using the wait command.	
Down-Stay	Dog is to be in the down position and is to remain there while you	
	leave and then come back.	
Come	This is used to recall the dog and have them come back to you	
	from whatever it is they are doing.	
Leave it	Do not touch whatever has got the dogs attention. Do not touch a	
	particular object
